

ORDINANCE NO. 2006-82

ORDINANCE BY THE FINANCE AND HUMAN RESOURCES COMMITTEE  
AMENDING AND CREATING SECTIONS OF THE RACINE COUNTY CODE OF  
ORDINANCES RELATING TO PARKING VIOLATION FORFEITURES

To the Honorable Members of the Racine County Board of Supervisors:

The Racine County Board of Supervisors do ordain as follows:

1. CHAPTER TWELVE

Section 12-76 of the Racine County Code of Ordinances relating to Stopping, Standing, Parking is hereby created:

**Sec. 12-76. Additional Parking Restrictions**

(a) No person shall park, stop or leave standing, whether attended or unattended, any vehicle:

- (1) In any manner as to block, obstruct, or limit the use of any road or trail; or
- (2) Outside of any area provided for such purposes of parking; or
- (3) Contrary to posted notices and/or signs; or
- (4) Contrary to any ordinance, law or other regulation.

Section 12-74 of the Racine County Code of Ordinances relating to Stipulation is hereby amended:

**Sec. 12-74. Stipulation**

Any person stipulating guilt or no contest to a violation of any of the provisions of Sections 12-72, 12-76, and/or 12-73 may deposit a stipulation of twenty-five (\$25.00) within five (5) days of arrest.

2. CHAPTER FOURTEEN

Section 14-78 of the Racine County Code of Ordinances relating to Parks and Recreation Areas Parking is hereby amended:

**Sec. 14-78. Same - Parking**

(a) No person shall park, stop or leave standing, whether attended or unattended, any vehicle:

- (1) In any manner as to block, obstruct, or limit the use of any road or trail; or
- (2) Outside of any area provided for such purposes of parking; or
- (3) Contrary to posted notices; or
- (4) For more than a four-hour period in those parking spaces designated as four-hour parking areas by the Public Works Director or his designee and those four-hour parking spaces shall not exceed fifty-seven (57) in number. These areas shall be designated as tow-away zones.

4 (b) The penalty for violation of subsection (a) above shall be a forfeiture of  
5 twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) within five (5) days of arrest. Any person  
6 stipulating guilt or no contest to a violation of same may deposit a stipulation  
7 of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) within five (5) days of arrest.

9 **3. CHAPTER SIXTEEN**

10 Section 16-1 of the Racine County Code of Ordinances relating to Parking  
11 Restricted is hereby amended:

13 **Section 16-1. Parking Restricted**

14 (a) No person shall leave or park any motor vehicle on property owned by the  
15 County in any manner contrary to a posted sign thereon, where such sign is  
16 in plain view and indicates limited or restricted parking.

17 (b) The penalty for violation of subsection (a) above shall be a forfeiture of  
18 twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) within five (5) days of arrest. Any person  
19 stipulating guilt or no contest to a violation of same, may deposit a stipulation  
20 of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) within five (5) days of arrest.

22 Section 16-69 of the Racine County Code of Ordinances relating to Penalties is  
23 hereby amended:

25 **Section 16-69. Penalties**

26 (a) Any person violating any provision of this Division shall forfeit twenty-five  
27 dollars (\$25.00), plus court costs.

28 (b) Any person violating any provision of this Division may stipulate to an amount  
29 of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) within five (5) days of arrest.
